

## IMPARTIALITY 5 CFR 2635.502



Impartiality Test: If a "reasonable person" could conclude that you lost objectivity or impartiality in one of these two situations, you need ethics help.

<u>Impartiality Question #1</u>: Are you aware that a member of your household has a financial interest that is directly & predictably affected by a <u>particular matter involving specific parties</u> you work on?

<u>Impartiality Question #2</u>: Are you aware that a person with whom you have a <u>covered relationship</u> is or represents a party to <u>particular matter involving specific parties</u> you work on?

If the answer is YES to either #1or #2 contact the Office of Ethics for advice.

The inspection of an Establishment is one type of <u>particular</u> matter involving specific parties.

Who do you have a <u>covered relationship</u> with?

- 1. A member of your household, or a relative to whom you are personally close;
- 2. Someone you have a business or contractual relation with;
- 3. A spouse's, child's, or parent's employer or business partner.
- 4. A former employer (w/in last year);
- 5. A non-political, non-federal organization where you are actively serving as an official/leader.

BOTTOM LINE- Be careful about working on an inspection or other matter involving someone you have a relationship with or that might affect their interest somehow.
